REGULATIONS

of the online conference under the name: 12th Young Sociologists Congress (hereinafter referred to as the "Regulations")

§1 Organizer, date, and duration of the Event

These Regulations define the rights and obligations of the participant in the online conference of the 12th Young Sociologists Congress, (also referred to as the "Congress"), hereinafter referred to as the "Event", which will be held on May 20-22, 2022 online via the Microsoft Teams online platform, (hereinafter referred to as the "Platform").

- 1. The Organizer of the Event is the Jagiellonian University (hereinafter referred to as the "Organizer"), ul. Gołębia 24, 31-007 Kraków
- 2. Scientific supervision over the course of the Event is provided by the Scientific Committee of the 12th Young Sociologists Congress (hereinafter referred to as the "Scientific Committee").
- 3. A participant of the Event is any natural person of legal age who, by April 10th, declares a willingness to participate in the Event in the manner referred to in §2 of the Regulations and accepts the rules of participation in the Event referred to in the Regulations (hereinafter referred to as the "Participant")
- 4. The Regulations are made available to Participants on the Event website: https://kms.confer.uj.edu.pl, hereinafter referred to as the "Event Website"), in Polish and English, in a way that allows their download.
- 5. The Organizer reserves the right to change the Regulations due to the change of generally applicable law and the need to adapt the Regulations to this change. The amendment to the Regulations will come into force upon its publication on the Event Website.
- 6. The Organizer reserves the right to change the date of the Event if its conduct within the period referred to in §1 above will be impossible or excessively difficult for reasons beyond the control of the Organizer, in particular due to restrictions, orders, and bans related to the introduction of a pandemic state. The change in the Event date will be immediately announced on the Event Website.
- 7. The Organizer reserves the right to make changes to the program of the Event, including the right to change the time schedule and the order of appearances. In the event of changes, the Organizer will inform about it immediately on the Event Website.

§2 Registration of participation in the Event

1. Participation in the Event is payable and takes place online on the Platform designated by the Organizer, to which the registered Participant will gain access after logging in to the Login Panel available at: https://www.microsoft.com/pl-pl/microsoft-teams/login. Logging in on the Platform's pages will be preceded by the acceptance

- of the Regulations and the granting by the Participant of the authorizations, permits, and licenses referred to in the Regulations.
- 2. Participation in the Event requires prior registration via the electronic form available on the website: https://kms.confer.uj.edu.pl, (hereinafter referred to as the "Registration System"), in which a person wishing to participate in the Event will be required to provide the following data: name and surname, e-mail address, affiliation, degree of study, field of study/scientific discipline, title of the speech and its abstract, information about the willingness/lack of willingness to receive an invoice for the registration fee paid, data for the invoice if you wish to receive an invoice.
- 3. The detailed method of registering participation in the Event and the dates are available on the Event Website: https://kms.confer.uj.edu.pl.
- 4. In the event of resignation from participation in the Event, the Participant is obliged to immediately inform the Organizer by sending relevant information to the e-mail address: kms@uj.edu.pl.
- 5. The Organizer is not responsible for providing incorrect or false data by the Participant when registering for the participation in the Event.
- 6. Online participation in the Event requires the Participant to have an ICT system that meets the following minimum technical requirements:
 - a. Internet access;
 - b. terminal device;
 - c. software that allows reading the file in various formats (including text, sound, graphic, multimedia, video, etc.)
- 7. The provisions of the Regulations bind the Participant to the Events. Upon logging in to the Platform to participate in the Event, the Participant confirms that he has read the Regulations and accepts the provisions of the Regulations, which is tantamount to granting by the Participant the authorizations, permits, and licenses referred to in the Regulations. The Participant's logging in to the Platform to participate in the Event is made when the Participant's data is completed in the Login Panel and sent by the Participant together with the consents referred to in §5-7 of the Regulations, using the system available on the website at: https://forms.office.com/r/c295yEN154.

§3 Rights and obligations of the Event Participants

- 1. During the Event, Lectures by speakers and a Debate will be presented. Participants will be able to ask questions to the speakers on-line via chat available on the Platform's websites, in real time, during the Event. Detailed information and the exact program of the Event are available on the Event Website.
- 2. Each registered online Participant has the right to participate, via the Platform, in Lectures of their choice as part of oral sessions and in accompanying events, i.e. discussion panels, workshops. The events will be conducted in Polish / English.
- 3. Each online Participant has the right to submit questions to the authors of the Lectures via the chat available on the Platform's websites. From among the questions sent, the chat moderator will choose those that will be asked to the author of the Lecture at the time allocated for that time, after the end of the given Lecture session.

- The Organizer, considering the planned duration of these Lectures, as well as the schedule of the Event, will decide on the number of questions to be asked.
- 4. The Organizer of the Event, by providing the Participants with conference materials, pays special attention to the necessity to respect intellectual property rights by the Participants. Participants agree to use the materials provided to them by the Organizer only for their own personal use. Modifying, copying, sending, public performance, and any use of these materials for commercial purposes requires the prior written consent of the Organizer or another authorized entity. Participants are fully responsible for any damage caused as a result of their behavior contrary to the above reservation.
- 5. Participants accept the established rules for the course of the Event and its program and agree not to change it or disrupt the course of the Event. The Organizer is entitled to exclude from participation in the Event Participants who breach the provisions of the Regulations, and in particular:
 - a. disrupt the course of the Event;
 - b. undertake actions that are inconsistent with the law, morally, or against the legitimate interests of third parties;
 - c. take actions aimed at circumventing or indicating an attempt to circumvent the Regulations or the rules of the Event;
 - d. take actions that violate the legitimate interests of the Organizer or harm its image.
- 6. The Organizer of the Event is not responsible for:
 - a. incorrect or faulty operation of the software used by the Participant;
 - b. lack of or interruptions in access to the Internet for reasons attributable to the Participant;
 - c. defectiveness of the computer equipment used by the Participant;
 - d. incorrect operation of the Platform by the Participant;
 - e. other circumstances preventing or hindering participation in the Event, not caused by the actions or omissions of the Organizer.

§4 Speakers

- 1. The Organizer reserves the right to indicate which Participants will present the Lecture as part of the Event. They will be hereinafter referred to as "Speakers". Their original Lecture (hereinafter referred to as the "Recording") will be made available to other Participants during the Event, in real time on the Platform's pages, and also multiplied and recorded along with other Lectures, in the form of Reports from the Event, which may be made available on the Platform's pages until on 22/06/2022 for logged-in participants of the Event.
- 2. Taking the actions referred to in par. 1 above is an expression of granting the Organizer a nonexclusive license to use the Lecture and the Recordings, under the conditions set out in §5-7 of the Regulations, for the purpose of deciding on qualifying the Participant as a Speaker, as well as for the organization and conduct of the Event.

- 3. Delivering a Lecture and granting the Organizer the authorizations, permits, and licenses referred to in §5-7 of the Regulations in all the fields of use indicated therein are free of charge and for the statutory purposes of the Organizer.
- 4. Granting the Organizer the authorizations, permits and licenses referred to in §5-7 of the Regulations is voluntary, but necessary for a Speaker to deliver a Lecture.

§5

License to use the Lecture

- The speaker is fully responsible for the form and content of the Lecture. The speaker undertakes to prepare and present the original Lecture that will not infringe upon the rights and personal rights of third parties, contain theses and views inciting hatred or discrimination against any people on the grounds of race, culture, ethnicity, religion, or gender. Moreover, it is unacceptable to propagate in the content of the Lecture on ideology and symbolism related to totalitarian regimes.
- 2. If any part of the Lecture are legally protected elements, the rights to which will not be vested in the Speaker, the Speaker guarantees that he is entitled to use them to the extent necessary to deliver the Lecture and grant the Organizer a license with the right to grant a sub-license referred to in this paragraph, without the Organizer having to obtain additional approvals and permits.
- 3. The Speaker agrees to make the Lecture Recordings available in real time with the use of live streaming on the Platform's websites and to its multiplication and consolidation in combination with other Lectures, in the form of a Report from the Event, which may be made available on the Platform's website by 22/06/2022.
- 4. The speaker grants the Organizer a nonexclusive, unlimited territorially, quantitatively, and qualitatively license with the right to sublicense the same scope as the license to use the Lecture in the form of a Report from the Event in whole or in part, independently, as part of a collective work, in the list with works and elements freely chosen by the Organizer (including Lectures by other Speakers as part of the Relationship with Events and so-called conference materials, referred to in §3 sec. 4 of the Regulations, the initial and final board), as well as its studies, adaptations and all materials, graphics, fragments, shots, documentation created during the recording of the Report from the Event, as well as after it for informational, educational and documentary purposes of the Event, including in particular its use, sharing on the Internet, Intranet, as well as a part of any telecommunications services using any systems and devices, on the Platform's websites and on other Organizer's websites.
- 5. The license referred to in sec. 3-4 above (hereinafter referred to as the "License"), is granted to the Organizer upon online registration by the Speaker, pursuant to the provisions of §4 section 1 of the Regulations, for an indefinite period and includes the use of the Lecture, in particular in the following fields of use:
 - recording and reproducing the Lecture producing copies of the Lecture using the magnetic recording technique and digital technique (including DVD, magneto-optical carriers);
 - b. in the scope of disseminating the Lecture public performance, display, playback and broadcasting, as well as public sharing of the Lecture on the Platform in such a way that each logged-in Participant of the Event could have access to it at a place and time selected by them in the period until

- September 30, 2021 ., using all available techniques, including the use of the Internet, Intranet, and other computer networks, broadcasting the Lecture via multimedia and ICT networks;
- c. in terms of trading in the original or copies on which the Lecture has been recorded marketing, lending the original or copies;
- d. creating and disseminating derivative works of the Lecture, including further projects / materials based on the Lecture or their individual elements, including the development of different graphic, color versions or visual or spatial format of the Lecture and the use of derivative works thus created to the extent and at all the fields of use specified in this paragraph;
- e. modifying the Lecture in whole or in part and developing it in whole or in part, including, inter alia, the right to correct, modify, and change the entire Lecture or its individual elements;
- 6. The license also includes the Organizer's right to exercise dependent rights to the Lecture in all the fields of use referred to in sec. 3- 5 above including the right to make changes to the Lecture and to prepare it, use, and dispose of derivative works and to allow third parties to exercise derivative copyrights to the Lecture.
- 7. The speaker authorizes the Organizer and entities acting on their behalf to exercise their moral rights to the Lecture, in particular the right to the inviolability of the content and form of the Lecture and its reliable use, to decide on the first release of the Lecture to the public, to supervise the use of the Lecture and to decide on the method of marking the author of the Lecture and undertakes not to exercise these rights towards the Organizer and the entity acting on their behalf.
- 8. Upon online registration, the Speaker grants the Organizer a nonexclusive, unlimited territorially, quantitatively, and qualitatively license for an indefinite period, with the right to sublicense the same scope as the license, for the use of the Lecture, in the fields of use analogous to those referred to in §2 and 4-7 above. The provisions of sec. 1 and 2 of this paragraph.
- 9. Upon the delivery of the Lecture, the Speaker grants the Organizer a nonexclusive, unlimited territorially, quantitatively, and qualitatively license for an indefinite period with the right to sub-license the same scope as the license to use the Record, in the fields of use analogous to those referred to in paragraphs 2 7 above. The provisions of sec. 1 and 2 of this paragraph. In addition, the Speaker authorizes the Organizer and entities acting on their behalf to perform technical quality control of the recorded Lecture (QC quality control), including checking the correctness of the file (containder, codec, bitrate), its length, trimming the beginning and end, adding a starting and / or ending board.
- 10. Notification by the Participant of the will to speak and selection of the Participant as a Speaker is tantamount to consent to grant the Organizer the licenses and permits referred to in §5-7 of the Regulations.
- 11. In the event of claims by third parties in relation to the Organizer or an entity authorized by them to use the Lecture, claims related to these works or their individual elements, the Speaker:
 - a. release the Organizer and persons authorized by them to use the Lecture from the claims in question, to the extent that he was obliged to purchase from third parties' rights to the legally protected element, including proprietary and

- related copyrights to these works and their individual elements, and to obtain from them the permits and authorizations referred to in this paragraph and
- b. will be fully liable for any damage suffered by the Organizer and persons authorized by them to use the Lecture due to the claims against them referred to in point a) above, including primarily, but not exclusively, damages related to a claim for compensation for their unlawful use or unlawful use of their individual elements.

§6 Consent to use the image

- 1. The Organizer will record the course of the Event using sound and image recording devices for educational, information, and Event documentation purposes.
- 2. Participation in the on-line conference is tantamount to granting the Organizer consent to share their image in real time using live streaming of the Events on the Platform's pages and to record the Participant's image in the Report from the Event, which may be made available on the Platform without the right to remuneration for the above title on the terms set out in this paragraph.
- 3. Turning on the end device camera by the Online Participant is tantamount to granting the Organizer consent to share their image in real time using live streaming of the Events on the Platform's pages and to record the Participant's image in the Report from the Event, which may be made available on the Platform without the right to remuneration based on the above, on the terms set out in this paragraph.
- 4. The Participant's consent, referred to in sec. 3 above includes the Organizer's dissemination of the Participant's image in real time via the Platform and recorded in the Report from the Event in connection with participation in the Event by: recording, reproducing using magnetic recording techniques and digital techniques, disseminating, using, placing on the market, lending, public performance, display, playback, broadcasting, public sharing on the Platform in such a way that each logged in Participant of the Event can have access to it at the place and time selected by them using all available techniques, including the use of the Internet, Intranet, and other computer networks for the purposes referred to in §1 above.
- 5. Notwithstanding the provisions above, upon the delivery of the Lecture, pursuant to the provisions of § 4 sec. 1 of the Regulations, the Participant who is a Speaker expresses free, unlimited territorially, quantitatively, and qualitatively consent to:
 - a. transferring their image for the purpose of sharing (playing) the Lecture, via the Platform in real time using live streaming;
 - b. recording the image of the Speaker in the Report from the Event and the use of this recording, processing, duplication, and multiple dissemination of the image of the Speaker recorded in the above-mentioned manner without the need to approve them each time, to the extent and in a manner analogous to that referred to in §5 sec. 4 and 5 of the Regulations, in particular on the Platform's pages, for the purposes referred to in para. 1 above.

- 6. The Participant / Speaker is aware that the Report from the Event will be made available on the Internet on the Platform and will be available to logged-in Participants of the Event.
- 7. In connection with the use of the image, the Participant/Speaker will not exercise the right to control and each time approve the use of the image, including the right to approve in relation to the final form of the Report from the Event in which it was used and the right to each time indicate them as the person shown in the abovementioned Report from the Event, in particular indicating their name and surname, subject to paragraph 7 below.
- 8. The speaker will be marked in the Recording and Report from the Event by providing their personal data name, surname and the name of the parent entity. At the same time, the Speaker agrees to be marked in the manner indicated above. The speaker declares that such a designation is in accordance with their wishes and does not infringe on their rights.
- 9. The Participant will be marked in the Report from the Event by providing their personal data: name, surname, and the name of the parent entity. At the same time, the Participant agrees to be marked in the manner indicated above. The participant declares that such a designation is in accordance with their wishes and does not infringe on their rights.
- 10. The event may only be recorded by the Organizer. It is forbidden to record and take photos by Participants during the Event without the prior consent of the Organizer.
- 11. The organizer has the right to authorize other entities to use the image on the terms specified in this permit.

§7 Processing of personal data

According to Art. 13 of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (general regulation on data protection, hereinafter referred to as "GDPR"), the organizer informs that:

- 1. The administrator of the Participant's personal data is the Jagiellonian University, ul. Gołębia 24, 31-007 Kraków, represented by the Rector of the Jagiellonian University.
- 2. Jagiellonian University has appointed the Data Protection Officer, ul. Czapskich 4, 31-110 Kraków. Contact with the Inspector is possible by email: iod@uj.edu.pl or by calling 12 663 12 25 from Monday to Friday, from 8:00 to 15:00.
- 3. Participant's personal data will be processed for the purpose of:
 - a. performance of the contract, the subject of which is participation in the conference "12th Young Sociologists Congress" (also known as the "Congress"), as well as for the registration of participation in the Event, acceptance of applications, selection of a Speaker, i.e. pursuant to Art. 6 sec. 1 lit. b) GDPR, on the basis of a contract concluded by accepting the Regulations. The event, organized on May 20-22, 2022 by the Jagiellonian University Students' Club of Sociology at the Jagiellonian University, will be an online event using the streaming platform;

- b. conducting the Event and reporting from the Event and for educational, information, and documentation purposes of the Event in relation to the personal data of Participants and Speakers in the form of an image based on their consent, i.e. pursuant to Art. 6 sec. 1 lit. a GDPR.
- 4. Providing personal data by the Participant is necessary to conclude the contract, participate in the Event, and deliver the Lecture. Providing personal data in the field of image is voluntary.
- 5. The Participant's personal data may be made available to entities authorized to receive them based on generally applicable laws.
- 6. The Participant's personal data will be entrusted under the concluded personal data processing agreement, resulting from Art. 28 GDPR, between Jagiellonian University and Microsoft, which is the provider of the registration system and the Platform.
- 7. The Participant's personal data will not be transferred to third countries (outside the European Economic Area) or to international organizations.
- 8. Personal data of Participants will be kept for the duration of the organization of the Event and until the final settlement and closing of the Event, as well as until the claims that may arise from the performance of the contract referred to in point 3 lit. a), and in the scope indicated in point 3 lit. b above until the Participant withdraws the consent to data processing.
- 9. Personal data of the Participant in the form of name, surname, name of the parent entity, image may be recorded in the Report from the Event and processed on the Platform's pages in a way that allows loggedin Participants to access it, for information, educational and documentation purposes of the Event, including for the purposes of the coverage of the Event in accordance with §6 of the Regulations.
- 10. If the Participant is a Speaker, their personal data in the form of image, first name, last name, and the name of the parent entity will be processed as part of the Report from the Events on the Platform's websites until the consent to their processing is withdrawn, and in the case of other Participants, personal data in the form of image, first name, surname. and the names of the parent entity will be processed as part of the Event Report on the Platform's websites until consent to their processing is withdrawn.
- 11. The participant has the right to: obtain information about the processing of personal data and rights in accordance with the GDPR, access and rectify their data, as well as the right to delete personal data from the administrator's files (unless further processing is necessary to fulfill a legal obligation or to establish, investigate or defend claims), and the right to limit processing, transfer data, object to processing in the cases and under the conditions specified in the GDPR.
- 12. To the extent that the processing takes place based on consent, the Participant also has the right to withdraw consent at any time without affecting the lawfulness of the processing which was carried out based on consent before its withdrawal.
- 13. The withdrawal of consent to the processing of personal data can be sent by email to the following address: kms@uj.edu.pl, by traditional mail to the following address: Institute of Sociology of the Jagiellonian University, ul. Grodzka 52, 31-044 Kraków or withdraw in person by appearing at the Institute of Sociology of the Jagiellonian University, ul. Grodzka 52, 31-044 Krakow.

- 14. The Participant's personal data will not be subject to automatic decision-making or profiling.
- 15. The participant has the right to lodge a complaint to the President of the Personal Data Protection Office if he finds that the processing of their personal data violates the provisions of the GDPR.

§8 Final Provisions

- 1. These Regulations are made available to the Event Participants on the Event Website and shall enter into force on the day they are posted on the above-mentioned side.
- 2. The Organizer reserves the right to cancel the Event, change its program, and formula. The Organizer will immediately announce the cancellation of the Event on the Event Website. The Organizer will not be obliged to the Participants and Speakers to any other compensation or compensation in this respect, or to reimburse the costs incurred to participate in the Event and to deliver the Lecture.
- 3. In matters not covered by the Regulations, generally applicable provisions of Polish law shall apply.
- 4. These Regulations have been drawn up in two language versions: in Polish and in English, with the proviso that in the event of any discrepancy, the Polish language version is binding.
- 5. The court competent to consider disputes between the Organizer and Participants is the Polish court competent for the seat of the Organizer.
